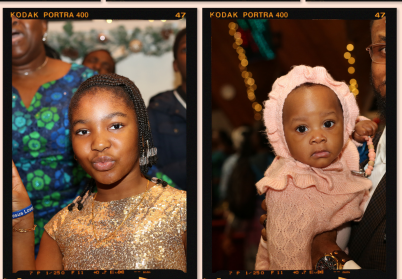
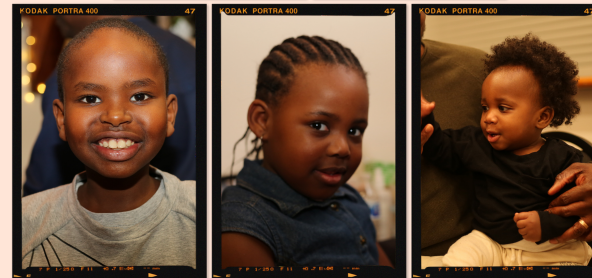

God's Heritage God's Precious Heritage

MEMORY VERSE: "Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord: and the fruit of the womb is his reward." - **Psalm 127:3 (KJV)**

INTRODUCTION

God's Word reminds us that children are not only a gift but also a heritage from the Lord. Whether we're adults or children ourselves, understanding our identity as God's heritage brings profound meaning and purpose to our lives. Let's explore what it means for children to be God's heritage and how we can honor and care for them.

1: Understanding God's Heritage Question: What does it mean for children to be God's heritage?

Children being God's heritage means they are gifts entrusted to us by God. They are to be treasured, nurtured, and raised in the ways of the Lord. For children, understanding that they are God's heritage means recognizing their intrinsic value and purpose in God's eyes. Each child is uniquely crafted by God, gifted with talents and abilities to fulfill His plans.

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 (KJV) - "And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up."

2: Responsibilities of God's Stewards Question: As stewards of God's heritage, what are our responsibilities towards children?

Our responsibilities include providing love, guidance, protection, and spiritual instruction. We are called to model Christ-like behavior and create a nurturing environment where children can thrive. As adults, let us cherish the opportunity to raise our children in the ways of the Lord, teaching them His commandments and demonstrating His love through our actions (**Deuteronomy 6:6-7**)

Let us create an environment where they can thrive spiritually, emotionally, and physically, nurturing their gifts and talents for the glory of God.

Proverbs 22:6 (KJV) - "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

3: Honoring God Through Caring for Children Question: How does caring for children honor God?

Caring for children honors God by demonstrating our obedience to His command to love and care for others. It also reflects God's heart for the vulnerable and helpless.

Matthew 18:5 (KJV) - "And whoso shall receive one such little child in my name receiveth me."

Whether adult or child, let us embrace our identity as God's heritage with gratitude and reverence. May we steward this precious gift with wisdom and love, seeking to fulfill His purposes and bring glory to His name. And may we always remember the words of **Psalm 127:3**, "Lo, children are an heritage of the Lord."
